ZERO WASTE EVENTS IN CSL

Côte St. Luc has initiated "zero waste" events, in which gatherings organized by the city, such as Canada Day, will only generate waste that can be recycled or composted, councillor Steven Erdelyi said last week at a meeting for his District 4 constituents.

"The city is trying to phase out all garbage," Erdelyi said. "You'll see that there will only be recyclable plastic or paper, or compostable materials. All the cutlery will be compostable and all the food will be as well. I believe we are the first on the island to do this. We'll encourage any outside organizations having an event in Côte St. Luc to follow suit."

DAY TRIPPING IN CSL:

Sunday's free concert by the Beatles tribute band Day Tripper was a "sell-out", as the planned outdoor show was transferred to the Côte St. Luc city hall auditorium which has a capacity of about 220. The reason for the transfer was iffy weather, as there were reports of rain in the West Island. The west end only saw heavy rain later in the evening. The show was great fun, including Danny Di Donato's very Paul McCartneyesque vocals, Peter Grant's vocals and resemblance to the late 1960s look of John Lennon, Jeremy Di Donato's amazing George Harrison-like guitar playing and Joey Ayoub's solid Ringo Starr-like drumming. Especially good were the performances from the Revolver album (She Said, She Said, Taxman), which were never performed live by the Beatles them-

St. Laurent green waste collection begins next week

St. Laurent is launching its first green waste collection for garden waste, which begins Sept. 1 and continues until Oct. 10, says a borough

The collection applies to all residential buildings in St. Laurent. Pick-up days are once a week and take place on different days for each district. Collection day is Tuesday for District 1, which is the area west of Marcel Laurin Blvd. and primarily south of Henri Bourassa West, stretching to the western limit of St. Laurent. Friday is collection day in District 2, the area north of Henri Bourassa, east of Marcel Laurin, west of O'Brien and north of Côte Vertu. Thursday is collection day in District 3, the area south of Côte Vertu and west of Decarie. Collection day is Monday in District 4, which is east of Decarie and O'Brien to the eastern borough limit.

The borough announcement also lists which waste is accepted and not accepted in the collection. Accepted are garden and landscaping waste; waste from dethatching; waste from garden or fruit trees; small branches, no more than one metre long and five cm in diameter, tied in bundles with fibre rope - wire is not accepted; and "although grass cuttings can be left for pick up, residents are strongly encouraged to practice herbicycling, which involves leaving grass cuttings on the

Not accepted are food waste, including table waste; tree trunks; leaves to
