# CSL's Canada Day includes Gary Carter field dedication

There will be no lack of activities during Côte St. Luc's Canada Day celebrations at Trudeau Park, with games and entertainment for adults and children.

But one of the undoubted highlights of the day will be the dedication at 9 p.m. of the Gary Carter baseball field — the main field -at the park, named after the former and well-loved Montreal Expos player who died Feb. 26 of this year of cancer.

Mayor Anthony Housefather, who will be speaking at the end of the ceremony, made the announcement of the naming at the annual Seniors Sports Celebrity Breakfast about three months ago.

Sunday's dedication can also be seen live. at p.m. CoteSaintLuc.org/GaryCarter, "where "viewers can watch live as Housefather, Montreal Expo Warren Cromartie, and other dignitaries unveil the design for a sign marking the city's primary baseball field," says a city announcement. Cromartie will also be speaking at the ceremony, and there will be pre-recorded video messages from teammates Andre Dawson, Tim Raines, Bryn Smith, Ellis Valentine, Rodney Scott, Rowland Office and former Expos general manager and field manager Jim Fanning.

"Gary Carter was a frequent visitor to Côte St. Luc during summers in the late 1970s and early 1980s at the Johnny Elias Grand Slam Baseball School. Housefather said, "Carter had fans across North America so we wanted to share our

event with them, live over the Internet," Other Canada Day activities will be plentiful, and the only departure from previous years is that there will be no new dedication of a human rights activist plague on the Human Rights Walkway at the park, Instead, Côte St. Luc and Bialik High School recently co-hosted a ceremony marking the 100th anniversary of Holocaust hero Raoul Wallenberg's birth.

Otherwise, pedal boats will be open to the public starting at 1 p.m.; a model airplane show will be presented by the Model Aeronautics Association of Canada, St. Lawrence Zone from 2 to 4:40 p.m.; a "remote control boat interactive experience" will be presented by the West Island Ship Modellers Club from 3 to 8 p.m.; the traditional citizenship ceremony will take place at 5 p.m., followed by a flag raising ceremony at 6 p.m. and Canada Day cupcakes at 7 p.m..

Lainie **Smajovits** initiated Sensitization Program for Secondary I students. It has just celebrated its 30th anniversary. Begun as a one-week project, Smajovits covered as many disabilities as she could in the classroom, organized a field trip and brought in a speaker with a disability.

It grew exponentially from there as Smajovits wanted to sensitize the students to the abilities of a wide range of people living with handicaps. While she formally retired two years ago after 35 years of teaching, she stayed on to cover some English courses and continue with the sensitization. Following a lead gift by Cindy Rabinovitch Heller and her husband Mark, sufficient funds were raised to keep Smajovits in the system for years to come.
